PROCLAMATION #1

PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY OF BLANCO PROCLAIMING OCTOBER 2025 AS

"Hill Country Night Sky Month"

WHEREAS,	the aesthetic beauty and wonder of star-filled skies are the heritage of all humankind and locally to the inhabitants of Blanco, Texas and are therefore worthy of celebration; and
WHEREAS,	the experience of standing beneath a star-filled night sky inspires feelings of wonder and awe, and may encourage interest in science and nature especially among young people; and
WHEREAS,	the opportunity to view star-filled skies attracts tourists to our region and therefore economic benefit to Blanco, Texas; and
WHEREAS,	preserving the rich historic heritage and starry night skies of Blanco, Texas is important to its residents; and
WHEREAS,	"light pollution," which is wasted light that performs no function or task and artificial light that goes where it is not supposed to go, creates glare, light trespass, sky glow, and overlighting; and
WHEREAS,	light pollution wastes natural resources amounting to at least \$2 billion per year and contributes to diminished American energy independence; and
WHEREAS,	the historical view of the night skies has been eroding in many nearby areas and generations are growing up with limited, if any, view of the wonders of the universe; and
WHEREAS,	the influx of people into the Texas Hill Country region and the accompanying light pollution from area lighting fixtures has been steadily on the rise; and
WHEREAS,	solving the problem of light pollution involves making better use of outdoor lighting to direct light down to where it is needed instead of upward into the sky, putting outdoor lights on timers and using outdoor lighting only where necessary; and
WHEREAS,	Hill Country communities are increasingly dedicated to the preservation of the region's night skies, as evidenced by the frequent educational activities conducted in our region and by the increasing number of places in our region recognized as International Dark-Sky Places by the International Dark-Sky Association, including: Enchanted Rock State Natural Area, South Llano State Park, the City of Dripping Springs, the Wimberley Valley, the City of Fredericksburg, the City of Horseshoe Bay, U Bar U Camp & Retreat Center, River Hills Neighborhood of Travis County, Lost Creek Neighborhood of Travis County and the City of Blanco; and
WHEREAS,	this regional effort and the preservation and celebration of our night skies is worthy of a month-long celebration.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the City Council of the City of Blanco, Texas:

- 1. October 2025 shall hereafter be known as "Hill Country Night Sky Month" in Blanco, Texas.
- 2. That the Mayor and the Blanco City Council encourage citizens to enjoy the night sky and to participate in Blanco County and the Hill County region's events and programs celebrating the night sky and promoting the ways in which communities are working to preserve it.
- 3. That the Mayor and the Blanco City Council encourage citizens to learn about light pollution and why it matters, night sky friendly lighting, and lighting regulations, and to implement practices and lighting improvements that will reduce light pollution, thereby preserving our night skies.
- 4. The Blanco City Secretary is hereby instructed to post this Proclamation for Public Display and enter this document into the permanent records of the City of Blanco.

In September 2025, the Blanco Police Department said goodbye to one of our own. Officer Romeo Tamez has moved on to continue his career with Harris County, and while we're sad to see him go, we wish him the very best in his future endeavors. His departure leaves us with two open positions, and we're actively looking for qualified candidates to join our team. We're also in the process of filling a reserve role as a new court bailiff, a position requested by the Municipal Court Judge and City Prosecutor.

On another note, the order for the new electronic speed indicator sign—approved by City Council at the request of the TPAC Committee—has officially been placed. We look forward to seeing it in action soon as another tool to help keep our roads safe.

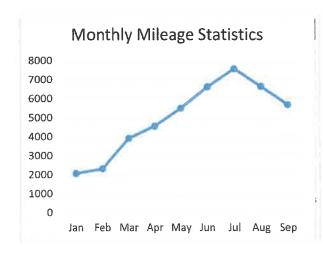

Summary

September 2025 highlighted both the dedication and resilience of the Blanco Police Department. While we said farewell to Officer Romeo Tamez, our remaining team members continued to carry a significant workload, responding to 558 calls for service and making nearly 300 traffic stops throughout the month. Officers issued 91 citations and 188 warnings, addressing a wide range of violations to keep Blanco's roads safe. Despite a 19% decrease in total traffic stops compared to the previous month, officers still uncovered and addressed more serious issues, reflected in the 400% increase in on-view arrests and the filing of four felony cases. These outcomes underscore proactive policing and attention to community safety.

Investigations also saw an uptick, with 59 reports taken in September — a substantial increase from the previous month. This included 20 offense reports, showing the continued vigilance of our Criminal Investigations Division in pursuing criminal activity. Meanwhile, officers managed an increase in motor vehicle collisions and maintained strong presence on patrol, logging over 5,600 miles within city limits to ensure visibility and rapid response.

Beyond the numbers, our officers stayed deeply engaged with the community — from school events and church gatherings to countywide activities — all while preparing for future programs like the Youth First Responder Explorer initiative. Combined with the forthcoming electronic speed indicator sign, these efforts reflect our commitment not just to enforcing the law, but also to building stronger connections and a safer environment for every resident.

A regular meeting of the City Council, City of Blanco, Texas was held on September 09, 2025, at 6:00 pm at the Byars Building, 308 Pecan Street, Blanco, Texas.

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 PM by Mayor Cargill, followed by roll call announcing a quorum was present. The Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Bryn Caddell. The Council members present: Mayor Cargill, Mayor Pro-Tem Moore Jr. and Council Members Mack-McClung, Thrailkill, Behrends Jr., and Moses.

City staff present: Warren Escovy, City Administrator, Jose Martinez, Finance Director, Haylee Hartman, Deputy City Secretary, Danny Maldanado, Inframark, Chief Jerry Thornhill

Announcements:

- Chief Thornhill presented Officer Angel Vallejo of the Blanco Police Department with a Life-Saving Award for actions taken on August 10th, 2025, where Officer Vallejo administered Narcan to an unconscious individual, thereby saving their life.
- Mayor Cargil also spoke about being in stage 3 restrictions and testing the water; and about some local events happening such as how Market Days will be starting again soon, making sure to shop local! The TCEQ meeting on Sept .11 at Gem of the Hills and Twin Sisters raise the roof on September 26th and 27th. Additionally, Mayor Cargill mentioned the city applied for two grants for financial management and technical assistance for public water and wastewater. She also announced that Garry Currier is back on Historical Commission.

Public Comments:

- Retta Martin- announced a mixer scheduled for September 16th at Gem of the Hills, starting at 5:00 PM, and highlighted the involvement of other groups in promoting commerce
- o Tori Achilles, owner of Hotel Henry, expressed concerns about the lack of communication regarding "hot funds" meetings, noting that two major hotels in Blanco were unaware of these important discussions despite their guests contributing to related taxes. They requested that concerns be investigated thoroughly, and a solution found to benefit all hotels.
- Robin Dallenbach- Spoke about her property that was proposed for annexation in 2013, submitted a public information request and reiterated their desire to have their property removed from city limits.

 - Mayor Cargill presented two proclamations: one designating September 22nd-26th, 2025, as Fall Prevention Awareness Week, and another authorizing September 2025 as Senior Center Awareness Month. These proclamations highlighted the risks of falls among older adults and the importance of senior centers in reducing social isolation and nutrition insecurity.

PRESENTATION:

Staff Presentations:

- 1. **City Hall, Warren Escovy, City Administrator** shared the following: Balanced Budget with over 60k in rainy day fund. He thanked the council for looking for ways to save. Sewer line update-getting close to 90% plan. Neighbors Market submitted CLOMR-will take 6-8 months to be completed. The City of Blanco Permitting Clerk, Selina, facilitated an agreement with PEC to replace non-compliant dark sky lights with 2700 Kelvin shielded lights at no charge.
- 2. **City Hall, Jose Martinez, Finance Director-** August Financial Report- Jose gave an update on the budget. 97% of the ad valorem we have been able to collect this year. Court is on target to meet budget for the year. Exceeded Revenue in Water Department.
- 3. **Police Department- Chief Thornhill** presented the August 2025 monthly report. Calls went up 11.6% in the city limits, however calls went down on out of city limit calls and assist other agencies. Offenses went down, but the arrest rate went up. 2 patrol units are going to auction. All true vehicles are in commission and working.
- 4. **Danny Maldonado with Inframark-** The water treatment plant, though theoretically operational, has been offline for many years and requires further assessment and testing before being fully activated. The wastewater treatment plant is currently in compliance with no violations. Efforts are underway to support local vendors and hire local residents, with a new employee starting next week. Public Works is compiling a list of faded stop signs for replacement and clearing signs to improve visibility. They also responded to community concerns, such as a sewer manhole issue, and are addressing downed trees. Fiber optic installation is underway, and the city is coordinating with contractors to minimize

damage to infrastructure. Fire hydrants are being painted and marked for fire flow tests, and efforts are continuing to make dark sky compliance a reality. The installation of "no engine brake" signs is being coordinated with TXDOT. An update on the cloudy water situation, believed to be caused by iron, indicated it was a cosmetic issue and not a drinking problem, with efforts to provide further information on its duration.

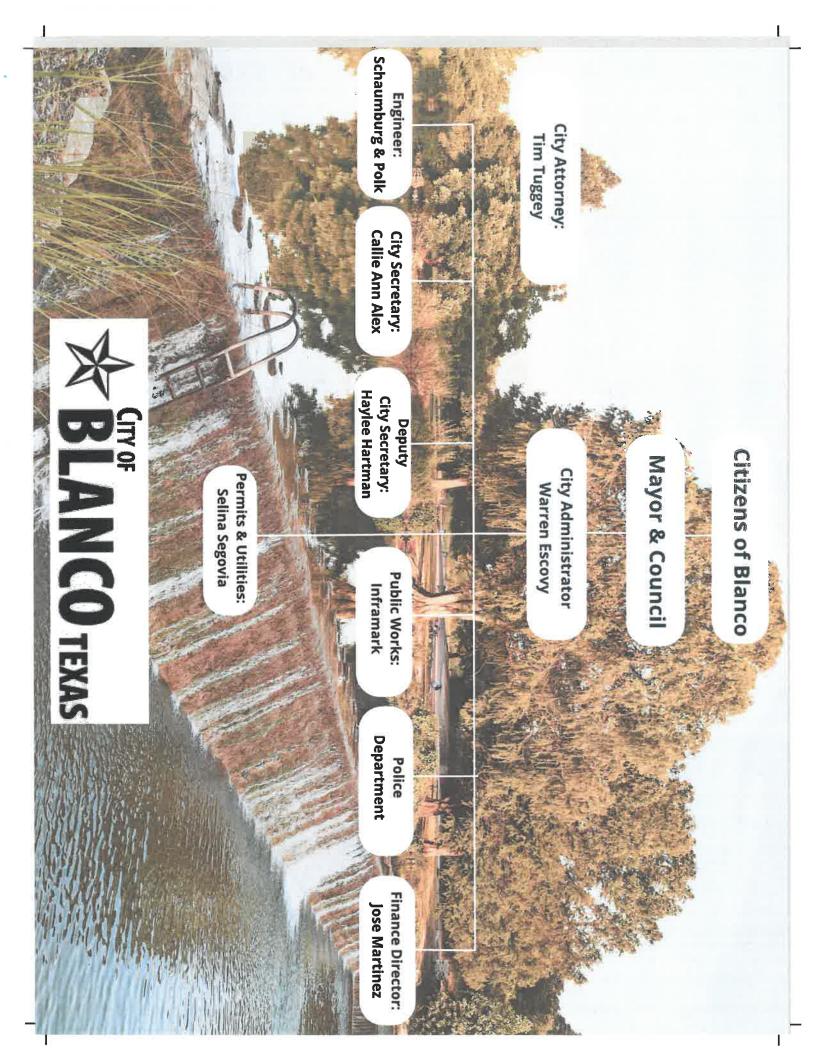

There was a PIR on how the HOT funds has been administered and there have been some concerns and possible inconstancies.

DESCRIPTION: Waive or delay of utility cut-offs for November and December

ANALYSIS: The Customer service Rep/utility billing department engages with Inframark to have utility customers who have not paid "cut-off" generally on the 21st of the month or the Monday if the 21st lands on a Friday or weekend. Bills are due on the 10th of the month with notices being mailed out to residents who did not pay on that date. Prompt utility payments are necessary to have a healthy Enterprise fund to continue utility operations.

It has been the policy of the City council to NOT cut-off residents during the holiday season so either a one week delay or a waiver for November and December is allowed. The City waived "cut-offs" last year.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION: Waive cut-offs for the months of November and December resuming the practice back in January.

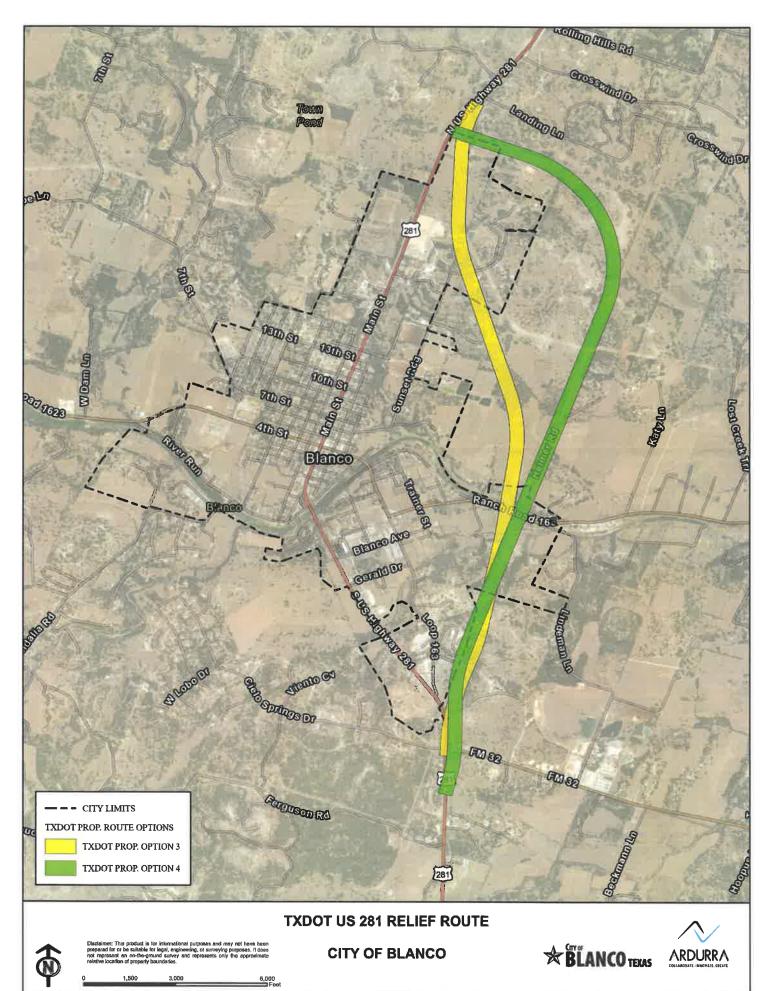
ANALYSIS: The City of Blanco requested a relief route study to help alleviate traffic that has been growing on US 281. TXDOT put together studies, public meetings and came up with two basic routes both which go through Blanco City limits and Blanco's ETJ. Neither of the two routes have been funded and appear to be in limbo.

The City Council in January of 2024 requested that TXDOT provide a route outside the City and it's ETJ. In January of 2025 the city council reaffirmed this position.

DESCRIPTION: Redbud Café (Brieger Enterprises, LLC) is requesting the City abandon an 8" sewer line behind the Redbud café.

ANALYSIS: Redbud Café is requesting the City abandon an 8" sewer line from the west end of the property line (where Texas Regional Bank sits) to 3rd Street.

Redbud Café is a restaurant that serves lunch, breakfast and provides dinner and entertainment on the weekends. Their management is looking at an expansion project that would include live music, expanded hours, and an expanded area to accommodate more entertainment options along with the capacity to hold more visitors. The current 8" sewer has a flow problem somewhere between Redbud, the Post office and Third Street. Redbud is responsible to replace the line because it is their new development that requires that the sewer line to fixed or replaced. It is acceptable to have the sewer line be private because Redbud will be the only entity using this utility once the Post office is developed into a part of the restaurant.

The City's only condition is that a dead-end clean out will need to be provided by Redbud so that the City can service the line when needed.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION: Abandon the 8" sewer line behind Redbud Restaurant parallel to 4th Street from their western property line (abutting TRB) to 3rd Street to allow them to replace it with a new sewer line. This is conditioned on them providing a dead-end clean out at the time of construction.

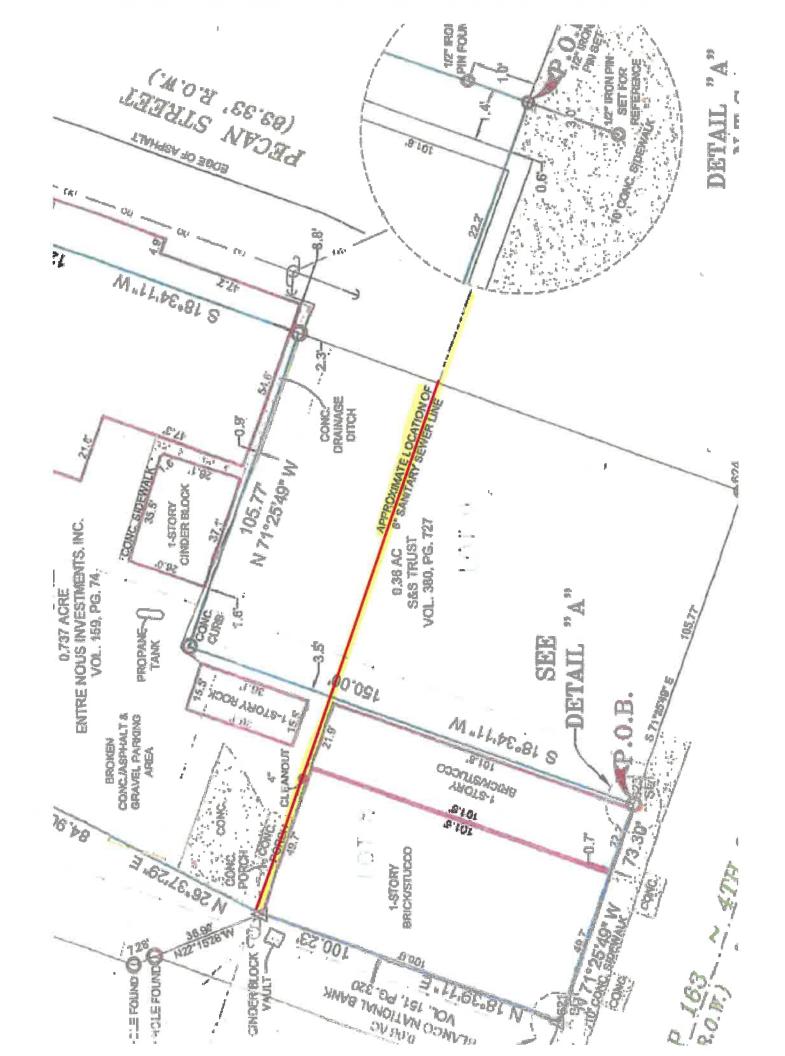

ANALYSIS:

The City has just over \$100,000 in reserve funds for the Enterprise fund and with a positive of only about \$150,000 of revenue over expenses in FY 26' the City needs to look at revenue streams which would include both systematic rate increases (3-4% to keep up with inflation) and some creative revenue generators.

- Military facilities have contracted with historically underutilized businesses in the past to do all sorts of projects
- They are starting to look at working the Municipalities and have started in places like Georgia and now possibly Texas
- Bryan Logan was the Deputy Commander for Joint Base San Antonio before he retired. JBSA is Lackland, Bullis, Fort Sam Houston and Randolph
- Inframark would want to bid on jobs using the Blanco name and Blanco would get a fee
 for being the contractor to Joint Base San Antonio (JBSA) with Inframark as a sub
- Blanco would have two agreements: one with the military facility the other with Inframark who would do all the work with a crew independent of the Blanco Crew.
- City Admin would have to attend (probably by Zoom quarterly or monthly meetings)
- Inframark claims that they would handle any and all complaints
- Guaranteed revenue stream for up to 10 years. There are various contracts from 5 to 20 years. 10 is the most common
- Contracts could create revenue of \$100,000 to \$200,000 annually (or more)

An Intergovernmental Support Agreement (IGSA) is a formal **partnership** between a U.S. military installation (such as an Army post) and a local, state, or tribal government to provide services or support that benefit both parties.

Authorized under 10 U.S.C. § 2679, allowing military installations to enter into direct agreements with local governments.

Purpose:

To improve efficiency and reduce costs by using existing local government services instead of contracting them out separately.

Common Services Provided:

Public works (water, sewer, road repair); grounds maintenance; waste management; emergency services (fire, EMS) and fleet maintenance.

Duration:

IGSAs can last up to 10 years and are not subject to the federal acquisition regulations (FAR). Senate bill has been introduced to move to 20 years.

DESCRIPTION: Variance request to NOT require a sidewalk Hackberry due to public safety

reasons (CITY REQUEST due to PUBLIC safety concerns)

ANALYSIS: In September of 2024 City Council denied a request to not put in sidewalks for a project of 8 single family lots because both Council and P&Z wanted connectivity to other neighborhoods. Staff's recommendation had been to require sidewalks on Elm Street and 7th Street because of nearby sidewalks but to NOT require sidewalks on 6th and Hackeberry due to the size of the paved portions of the roadway.

The subdivision plat was later approved at seven lots. The project proceeded with the seven lots to take access from both Hackberry and Elm Street due to the longer length of the block on those two roads. Although the subdivision plat dedicated a 10' sidewalk easement the paved portion of the road encroaches on the owner's property by 4.'

Hackberry paving is 17' wide with a 20' ROW. In September of 2024 we believed the ROW to be 55's as provided by the applicant's engineer. The Surveyor has now proven that the ROW is 20'.

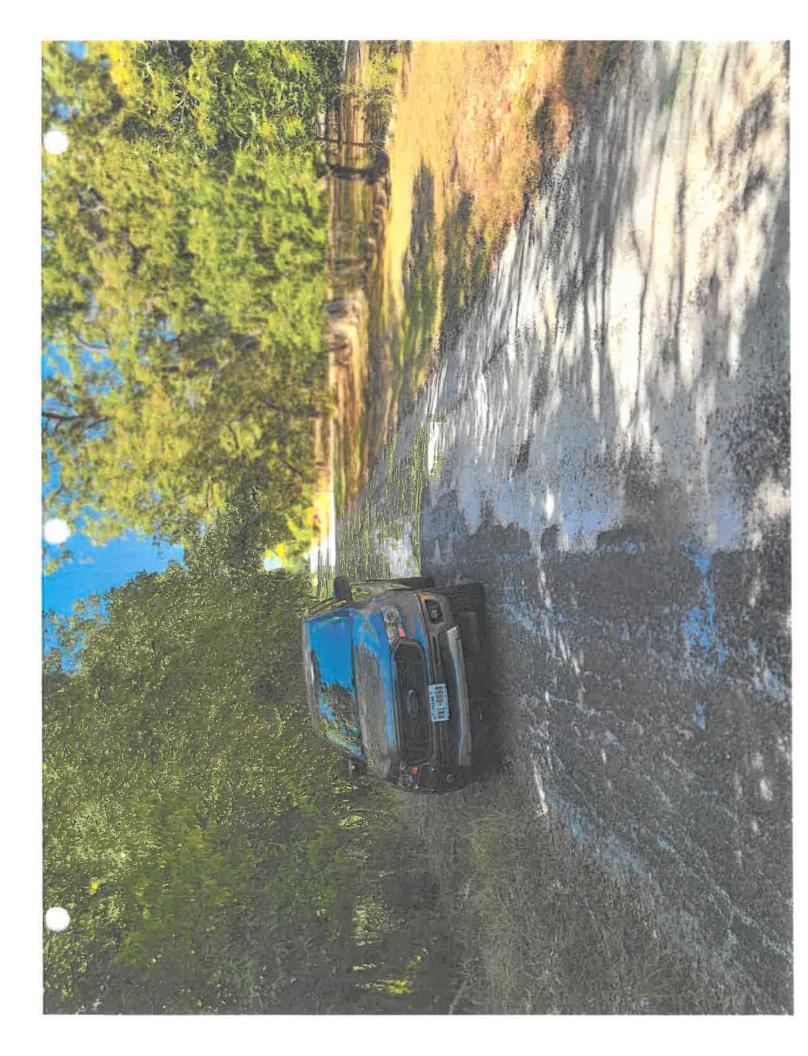
- 1. Paying is 17' and if the sidewalks were installed the roadway would b 13' wide.
- 2. A ditch on the west side makes improving the ROW or paving very difficult
- 3. A Ford F-150 is almost 7' wide with a mirror on one side. My Ford Ranger and an F-250 type truck had to pull in the ditch to avoid each other when I drove on Hackberry.
- 4. The plans show 4 homes will take access from Hackberry. The driveways won't work on 13'
- 5. City plans to do some filing in with cold mix to make the road safer.

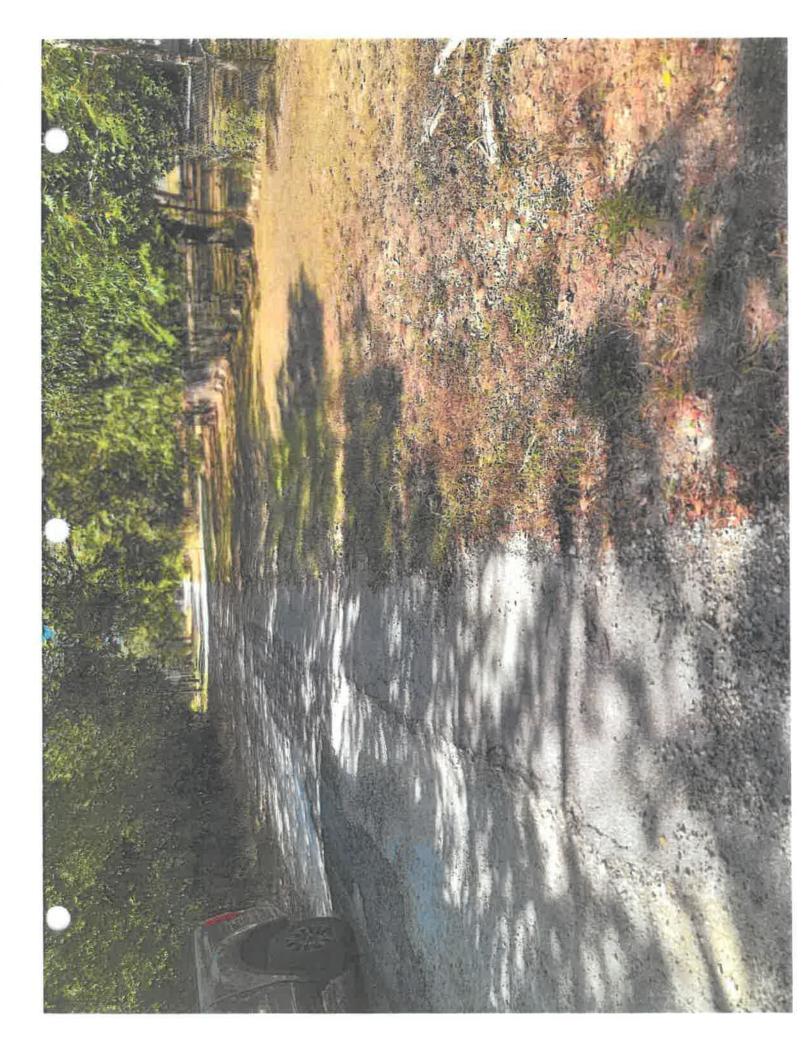
P&Z discussed asking the applicant to dedicate the 4' of property where Hackberry pavement exists (so the property owner doesn't own the portion of the road) and to have the City mill the road, place caliche on the existing paved surface and 4' of additional paving on the west side for 21' of surface.



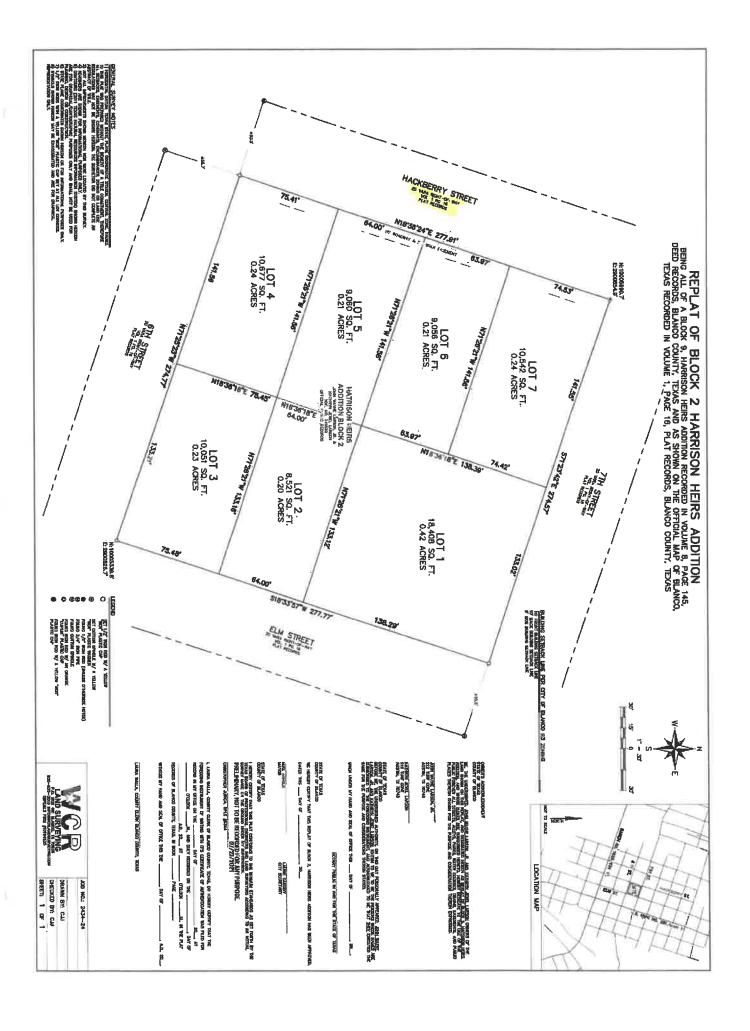

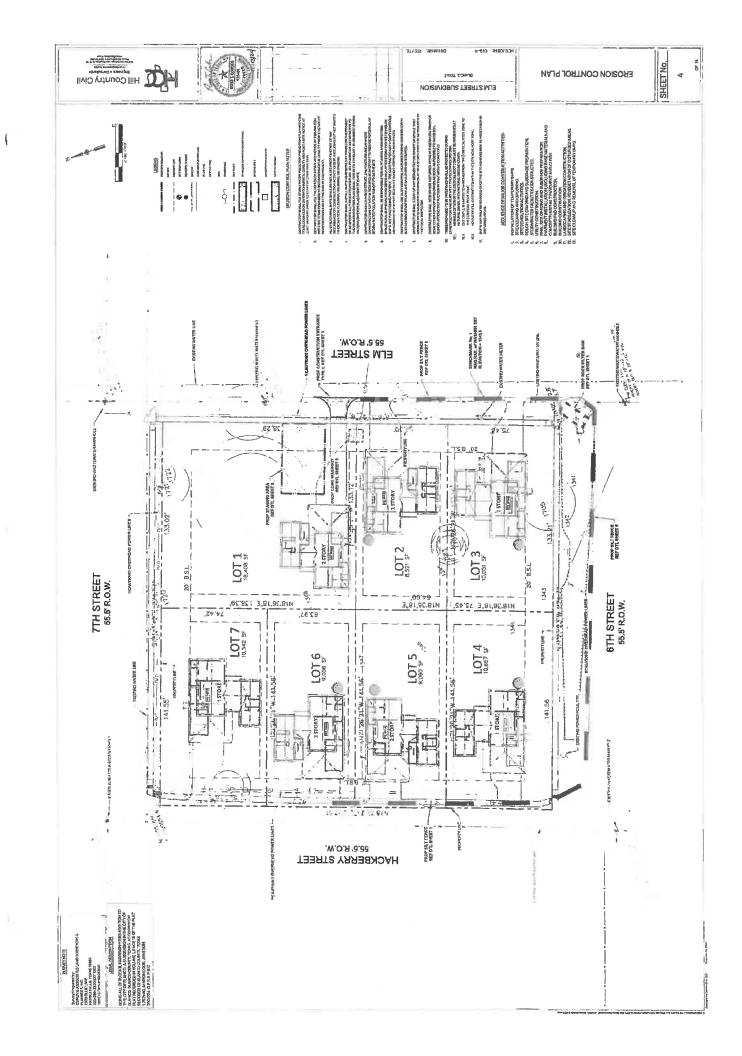

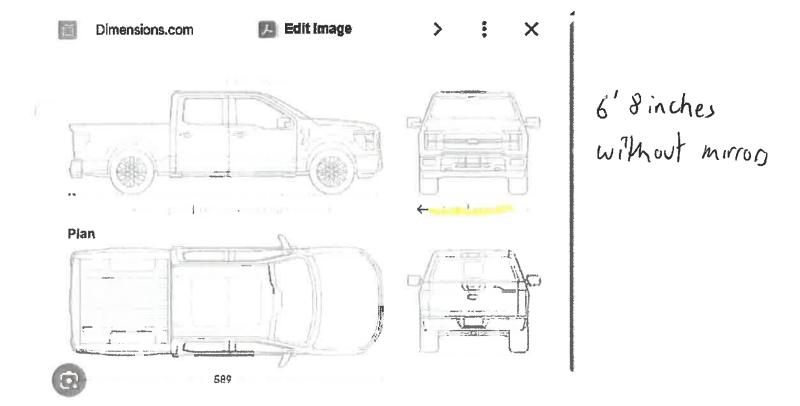

ANALYSIS: A 1.752 acre tract being an entire City block near the City core more specifically bounded by Elm Street, 6th, 7th, and Hackberry Street. The development would normally require sidewalks on all areas where ROW abuts the lots. The applicant is proposing 8 single family lots on this city block in the R-3 zoning district which would allow for this type of density.

P&Z needs to establish a hardship whether it be topography or not enough ROW, drainage or some other issue that pushes the City to grant a variance. The applicants explain that there is an expense to sidewalks (4'). The City's comprehensive plan discusses pedestrian pathways and our newest subdivision Los Altos has them on the sides that has no drainage ditch. A large drainage ditch is usually the reason given for not providing a sidewalk but some kind of pathway can be provided instead. Connectivity to other sidewalks is also very important.

The north side of Seventh Street has sidewalks that mostly connect to both the Middle School and is across the street from High school ball fields. Elm Street has some sidewalks mostly near Uptown Blanco.

FISCAL IMPACT: 8 single family lots would provide substantial ad valorem to the city while providing additional single family home options in the City.

RECOMMENDATION: Require sidewalks on 7th Street and Elm Street to promote connectivity and to NOT require sidewalks on 6th and Hackberry as there are no sidewalks near those streets.

Consideration, Discussion, and Take Possible Action on Approval of Le Domaine at Riviere Blanc Subdivision, Final Plat, 382.99 Acre Tract (ETJ), Blanco, Texas 78606 (Property Owner: Riviere Blanc Investments, LLC). The Planning & Zoning Commission recommended approval of final plat on condition of approval of drainage plans. The council can either 1) not approve final plat until plans are approved or 2) approve subject to final plat approval. 30 days from last Thursday, P&Z meeting. A motion was made by Council Member Moses to approve the final plat for LeDomaine at Riviere Blanc Subdivision on the condition that all Ardurra's conditions are met and give Warren the authority to approve, if Warren were to deny approval of final plat, bring back to the Council at that time, seconded by Council Member Cargill, motion carried unanimously.
